Sheep Worrying

There is concern that some dog walkers are not following the countryside laws, particularly on the Craig Rhiwarth mountain, which has been a problem as it is easy open access from the village. Please abide by the laws, keeping your dogs under control on leads where there are sheep. Even though a dog may not appear interested in sheep, dogs will sometimes do the unexpected, including chasing other wildlife which may mean running through the

sheep causing worry. Although the immediate worry may not appear to have caused a problem, the stress can be fatal to the sheep.



It is an offence under the Dogs (Protection of Livestock) Act 1953. If you are concerned about a dog worrying sheep, please contact 101 providing as much detail as possible, along with photographic evidence if you can.
